Re-thinking outreach approach

Outreach objectives

Meeting the **Atwood need :** Each Tuesday, 615 children need to get a sandwich and fruit (at the very least).



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- Providing quantity and quality of sandwiches on a consistent basis (some weeks, despite our best efforts, we simply did not meet the 615 target, in fact we had instances were we supplied nothing).
- Covid related concerns re supplying remade sandwiches.
- The PA supplying loaves of bread, fruit and spreads (especially as Prep-Prep) have, or vouchers which require sandwiches to be made at Athwood has created a logistic issue at the school - compounded by Covid related protocols.

PA contracts directly with the Peninsula School Feeding Scheme. They will provide an eco Proposal friendly, individually wrapped sandwich and fruit delivered to Athwood, ensuring all covid protocols are adhered to.

To make this work, we need R135, 000* This will provide every student at Athwood with a sandwich and fruit every Tuesday, for the rest of the year. Any extras will be shared with children at the school who would otherwise not receive any other meal for the day. If you're able to contribute, please do so directly into the PA account using "Athwood" as your payment ref.

* translates into an average of R200 per Bishops boy for the year

Outreach objectives



Our objective is to contribute to the development of a boy who is aware of his privilege and the resulting opportunity to contribute toward society - going beyond donation and towards involvement. We see this objective as part of school that is transformed, diverse and inclusive. (PA driven)



• Thus far, our boys have extremely loose connections to the objectives above through activities such as making sandwiches at school (small groups of the same boys) and at home, sharing messages and photos, bringing monetary or item donations to school.





The PA proposes a collaboration with the Vusa academy where needs of the Vusa and Langa community can be met through involvement of our boys. In this way we hope to enrich the lives of our boys as well as girls and boys from the Vusa academy.
