Chuma Maweni, a ceramic artist, presented and spoke about the exquisitely crafted ceramic vessels and furniture he has made. His work has been exhibited in the Iziko museum and the Southern Guild gallery. The Grade 5 learners learned about the very intricate process involved when creating ceramics of such high quality and the Grade 7 learners were able to think about career choices and understand that tenacity is a great part of success.
